# OBITUARY

Cyrus was born on January 21, 1942 in Orange, New Jersey to the late Cyrus II and Elizabeth Peters. Even though his love for trucking was apparent early on, his foremost love was for our Heavenly Father, Jehovah. He dedicated his life at the age of 10 and was baptized at Yankee Stadium on July 22, 1953. His sister Mari-Beth remembers "he would read his Bible every day."

Cyrus attended schools in East Orange and Irvington, New Jersey and studied auto mechanics. Upon graduation he entered the full time ministry service and built many treasured relationships along the way. His service included, preaching in segregated areas, during civil rights eras, attending Glead and Circuit Overseer work in Liberia, West Africa.
