Only Gimmick at Inaugural--You'll Need Cash

By JOHN HARRIS (Globe Political Editor) WASHINGTON, Jan. 15—The nation's capital was gaily with inaugural fever today, expecting record crowds and a display of enthusiasm unmatched since Andrew Jackson's day.

A million-dollar extravaganza is about to open, celebrating the dawn of a new era as the Bay State's own John F. Kennedy takes over the White House.

But this year there will be one big difference in the festivities. Very little will be for free. Invitation holders who will flood in here on Tuesday should keep that in mind. Today there was made available a list of events of inaugural week. Only one was open to the public, other than the parade in the display of fireworks at the Washington Monument just before the Inaugural Ball Friday night.

As part of the inaugural parade, the Navy will enter a fleet exhibiting its ultra-modern navigation satellite called Transit, first successfully launched at Cape Canaveral last April. Four are due to be orbited in 1962.

An added engaging item: there will be at least 250 women from the armed services in the parade. Among these will be the eldest WAVE in the Navy, Yvonne H. Holm Harnay of Brighton, Mass.

Miss Harnay, who went back in the Navy during the Korean conflict when she was 31, served as a "Yeomanette" in World War I. The parade of course is public and an estimated million spectators are expected along the 2 1/2-mile route, a quarter of a million more than turned out for President Eisenhower's inaugural.

holders (\$3 to \$25) have been reserved, and most of these tickets have already been sold.

The best ones are the \$25 ones in the area outside the White House, where the new President and his wife will review the parade.

The Inaugural Concert Tuesday evening at Constitution Hall is open to those who purchased tickets, but the demand for those exceeded the supply and they were all sold out last Thursday. Only one other event was open to the public without charge, on Wednesday night at the Union Square. This will be a 10-minute pre-inaugural review of military bands, choral groups and drill teams that will take part in the parade. Tickets for five, some still available, must be obtained through your congressman.

Admission to all of these is by special invitation only, however.

The general inaugural invitation will not get its holder into the inaugural ceremony Friday, at the Capitol.

Thousands will overflow the Capital plaza, but millions will have the tickets for the show there, and these tickets are not for sale.

Seized by Pro-Lumumba Forces, Leaving Kivu With U.N. Escort

LUSIMBURA, Ruanda-Urundi, Jan. 15 (AP)—Six American missionaries and their families have been arrested by Congolese troops while seeking to leave the Congo's rebel-held Kivu Province, white religious said today.

In R. H. Bushnell of the Baptist mission had arranged for evacuation of the whole party, waiting 20 persons and the United Nations. The missionaries had given them an escort of U.N. troops in a bridge opposite the frontier of Ruanda-Urundi.

The 29 persons apparently all were members of the Congo U.N. trust territory.

Sneak Storm Howls In With 5 Inches of Snow

Light snow was forecast for tonight and tomorrow.

As the storm moved from New York into Connecticut and Massachusetts, it brought a forecast of heavy snow. The State Highway Department in Connecticut has ordered 100,000 tons and 750 gallons of equipment.

Rhode Island authorities put their focus on working against blizzards.
